Opobo River Port



Akwa Ibom State in Nigeria is the target location for the first biomethanol plant export.

The climate is warm and rainy; perfect for biomass. The state favors new industries and the International Starch Group is already there. Our site is marked green on the above chart. Access to the site is opened with a new navigational channel being dredged simultaneously with erection of our Ibom Food Factory on that site.

The river will be dredged to 10 m and riding on the tide carriers of 30.000 DWT will reach the new jetty on the eastern banks of the Opobo River – just south the existing Alscon jetty. Product tankers that size will just be able to enter the Port of Grenaa.

Port Harcourt

Port Harcourt became the center of the Nigerian oil economy. Its growth is further due to its position in the Niger Delta and its importance as the center of social and economic life in Rivers State.

The International Starch Group is already there having acquired the Rainbow Town in central Port Harcourt.



It is a mixed used development scheme comprising residential zones planned around a commercial core and with more than one thousand homes. Foreign oil companies will be our primary tenants.

Alesa-Eleme, near Port Harcourt has two NNPC refineries getting their crude supply of 100% Bonny Light, by pipeline from the Shell operated Bonny field.

Co-export of methanol and refinery products from the nearby Bunny River is obvious.

Grenaa Port



Grenaa is located at the east coast of Danish mainland Jutland and it has a deep sea port facing Kattegat – the sea connecting us to Sweden and the refineries in Gothenburg. These ports form so to speak the gateway to the Baltic Sea and the energy markets all the way around.



Grenaa is located at the peninsula northeast of Aarhus

A site near the Northern basin is available. The place is ideal for combined storage facilities for biomethanol and refinery products and as a distribution center.
